Traveling to Rome

Positioned as a hub of international travel, the city is easily accessible through a network of major airlines, connecting with numerous global cities.

By plane

Rome is well-connected globally, with two major airports: <u>Leonardo da Vinci International Airport (Fiumicino)</u> and <u>Ciampino-G.B. Pastine International Airport.</u> Fiumicino is the primary hub, hosting numerous international flights. Ciampino is a convenient option for those arriving from within Europe.

From the airport and back

• Taxis are readily available at Fiumicino Airport and

provide a convenient and comfortable option for reaching the city center. The taxi stand is located just outside the arrivals area. The journey to central Rome typically takes around 40 minutes, depending on traffic conditions. Please note: The only authorized taxis are white cars with the TAXI light on top. Do not accept offers by people who are not authorized being taxi drivers.

- For those seeking a hassle-free transfer, private shuttle services and shared transfers are available. These services can be booked in advance and offer a door-to-door service, ensuring a smooth journey to your destination in Rome.
- The Leonardo Express train is a popular choice, connecting the Fumicino airport to the central Termini Station in approximately 30 minutes.
- Buses, such as the Terravision shuttle, also provide cost-effective transportation to key locations in Rome. At Ciampino Airport, accessing transportation to Rome is convenient and diverse.
 - Taxis are easily accessible just outside the arrivals area, providing a comfortable option for reaching the city center. The journey typically takes around 30 minutes, though travel times may vary based on traffic conditions.
 - For those preferring a pre-arranged transfer, private shuttle services and shared transfers are available. Additionally, the Terravision shuttle and other buses provide cost-effective options, connecting Ciampino Airport to various key locations in Rome.
 - Travelers seeking a swift and direct route can also explore the option of using regional trains, ensuring a quick and efficient connection to the heart of the Eternal City.

By car or train

For those opting for a road trip, Rome is easily accessible by car. The well-maintained highway network ensures a smooth journey to the city. Secure parking facilities are available for your convenience.

Rome's main railway station, Roma Termini, serves as a central transportation hub, providing seamless connections to and from various national and international destinations. High-speed trains, like the Frecciarossa and Frecciargento, offer swift and comfortable journeys, making the travel experience both practical and enjoyable.

Public transport

In Rome, the metro system comprises three lines (A to C), with Line C currently undergoing extensive construction. During your city break, your primary reliance will likely be on subway lines A and B.

Ticket machines offer various options for purchasing tickets, and it's essential to note that a single ticket is applicable for all modes of public transport under ATAC, encompassing metro, trams, buses (excluding tourist buses), and several regional trains (Trenitalia 2nd class, Roma-Lido, Rome-Viterbo, and Rome-Giardinetti).
